Parish Transformation Meeting #4

~24 people in attendance for Meeting #4

We received the quantitative results from the Parish Transformation Survey. 60 surveys were received in English, 4 surveys were received in Polish.

The organization of the data received was unhelpful (and there was no analysis)...it was only available as a hard-to-read xerox of lists of frequency counts & total number of responses for each question. The questions which pertain to the frequency counts were also cut off part-of-the-way, so this data was not understandable without referencing the original questionnaire (which was not available at the meeting). The Polish responses were tabulated separately from the English responses; due to the low numbers, this is not very meaningful for stand-alone analysis. These should be combined...

Parish members will try to work-up the survey results themselves and present these next time.

We then began talking about the building blocks for Mission. Because no one had yet begun drafting a Mission Narrative (based on previous week's work), Harriet Siller, Chair of the Parish Council, volunteered to try. After each building block was discussed, those present voted on how much effort the Parish should put into each.

Building Blocks for mission:

Evangelization (pages 26-30 of mission workbook)

- The Parish could be segmented into different groups with differing needs. Reach out to school families, young adults differently.
- A need for **intentionality** in Parish evangelization efforts was mentioned
- Issues with divisions in the parish (3 separate parishes present at St. Helen—Polish-speaking, English-speaking, & School communities. Difficulties in integrating these were described
- Maybe approach Evangelization through service
